

GETTING STARTED

On one side of the beads, tie a loose knot or use a paper clip to keep the beads from sliding down the scoubi strands,

Gather the ends of 4 strands of scoubi and feed them through a heart bead, a round bead and then a second heart bead as shown in the picture.

Position the beads in the center of the strands of scoubi.

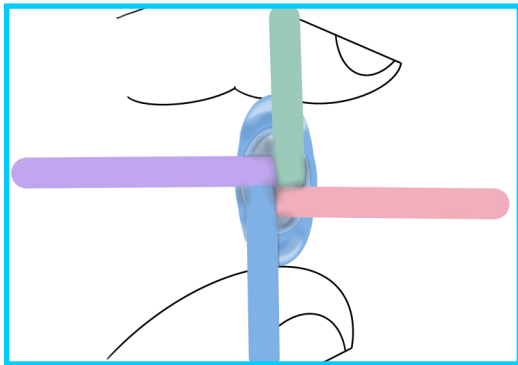
Hold the project with the knot at the bottom.

- 5.** Arrange the scoubi strands with one up, one down, one right, and one left. When arranging the strands, keep in mind that the colors across from each other will be beside each other on the project.



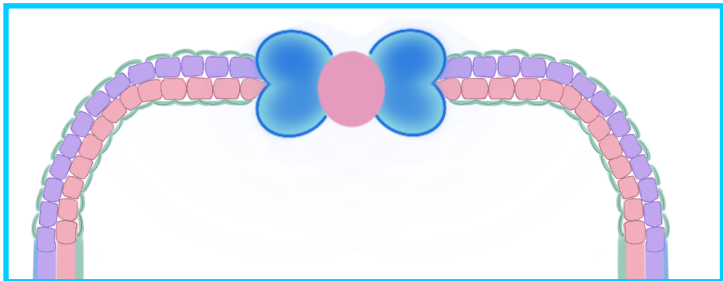
- 6.** Both, the box stitch or the round stitch work for this project. Your choice! The box stitch is shown below.

THE BOX STITCH

- A.** Move the purple strand from the left to the right side of the project, creating a small loop.
- B.** Move the pink strand from the right to the left of the project, creating a second parallel loop.
- C.** Move the blue strand from the bottom by feeding it over the pink strand and under the purple strand.
- D.** Move the green strand from the top by feeding it over the purple and under the pink strand.
- E.** Gently pull the scoubi strands and you should see a checkerboard pattern.

- 7.** Untie (or unclip) the other side of the project and repeat the process shown in Step 6 above.

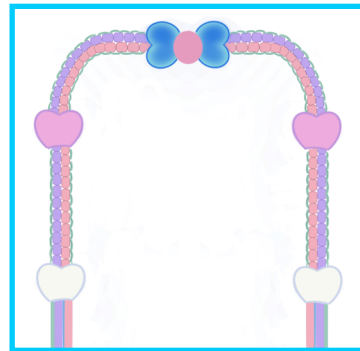
Repeat the box stitch until you have made approximately 13 stitches on each side of the beads. At around the 5th or 6th stitch, begin gently curving the project downward to form the top of the heart.



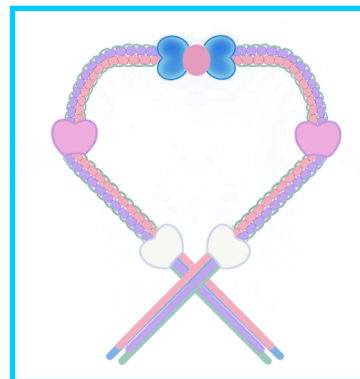
- 8.** Add a heart bead to each side of the project by feeding all of the strands through a heart bead.

Make approximately 11 more stitches.

Again, add a heart bead to each side of the project.



- 9.** Bring the two ends of the project together to form the point of the heart.



- 10.** Finish the project with an overhand knot as shown below.

OVERHAND KNOT

- A.** Gather all of the "tails" in one hand.
- B.** Make a loop by crossing the tails OVER themselves.
- C.** Feed all of the tails under and through the loop. Pull gently on the tails to tighten the knot.

- 11.**

- Trim the tails to the desired length.
- To make the top more curved, gently push the top beads towards the bottom of the project.
- Add a lanyard hook (optional).
